EQUIVALENCY EXAM INFORMATION SHEET

The Equivalency Examination may be taken as one of the prerequisites for the issuance of the Certificate of Personal Watercraft Operation.

Note: Taking an approved combination boating/personal watercraft/waterskiing course is recommended.

The Equivalency Examination is written for the **experienced** boaters who knows the rules and regulations for safe boating on all Connecticut waters.

The examination covers general information and safety topics, including, but not limited to:

1. Registration
2. Certification
3. Towing
4. Anchoring
5. PFD Requirements and Fit
6. Visual Distress Equipment
7. Fire Prevention
8. Sound Signals
9. Carbon Monoxide
10. Hypothermia
11. Boating Under the Influence
12. Aquatic Nuisances
13. Rules of the Nautical Road
14. Safety Equipment
15. Aids to Navigation
16. Speed Regulations
17. Age Restrictions
18. Water Sports
19. The Operation of **all** recreational vessels including personal watercraft (i.e. jet-skies) canoes and kayaks

- * Most, but not all, of the questions are covered in the CT Boater's Guide which can be picked up at your local town hall, DMV offices, local DEEP offices, public libraries or downloaded from the internet at <https://portal.ct.gov/boating>
- * The Exam covers all aspects of a basic boating/personal watercraft/waterskiing course.
- * A score of 80% or better is required to pass. A score of 78% or below is a failing score and the examinee would then be required to take an eight (8) hour course that is approved by the State of Connecticut and the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA).
- * The equivalency exam may only be taken once.

CONSERVATION ID NUMBER:

You must have a Conservation ID Number before taking the exam. If you do not have a Conservation ID Number, you can create one (free of charge) at: <https://ct.aspirafocus.com/internetsales/>

FEES:

- * \$75.00 to take the Equivalency Exam (**check or money order made payable to the "DEEP" mailed to the address above**). The exam fee must accompany the completed Equivalency Exam Application. **NO CASH OR CREDIT CARD ACCEPTED VIA MAIL.**
- * \$50.00 fee for the Certificate of Personal Watercraft Operation to be paid online after successful completion of the exam.

REFUNDS: May be requested in writing if you are unable to take the exam. An unsuccessful attempt of the exam cannot be refunded.

TEST DATES, TIME & LOCATION: Please mail your application, exam date preference and payment to the address above by the date indicated on the examination schedule. If the requested exam date is available, a confirmation letter will be e-mailed to you. The confirmation letter & valid photo identification are required for entrance into the exam. Virtual examinations will be through Zoom and in-person examinations will be at Marine Headquarters in Old Lyme, CT
